

SCHOOL DAY

School Hours

School Hours 9:15am - 3:15pm

Recess Time 11:15am - 11:40am

Lunch Time 1:10pm - 2:00pm

Home Time 3:15pm

Office Hours 8:45am - 3:30pm

Morning lines occur at 9:15am. All students are expected to arrive at school between 8:45am and 9:15am. There is no supervision in the playground before 8:45am or after 3:15pm.

Playing in the school grounds is not permitted after 3:15pm.

Students arriving at school prior to 8:45am must be booked and signed into Star Club, our Before/After Care provider.

Wet Weather

In the event of wet weather in the morning students will go to classrooms when instructed by the teachers on duty.

Classroom Etiquette

To allow teachers time to be best prepared for class each day, we ask parents and carers not to enter classrooms before school without an appointment. If there is an urgent matter, please come to the front office and we will arrange for someone to speak with you. Teachers mark the class roll and begin lessons straight away.

Late Arrival

Parents/carers must accompany and signin students at the school office when arriving late. The class roll is marked first thing in class. If your child arrives late and does not get a late note, their teacher would have already marked them absent for the school day. A late note corrects this and marks your child as "present" at school. Please bring your child/ren to the office with you if they are late to school.



Leaving Early

If students are leaving early from school, please email the school prior, this will be forwarded to advise the teacher. Upon your arrival, your child will be called down to the office. All students must be signed out by parents/carers at the school office prior to leaving.

Attendance at School

Parents and carers can help foster positive attendance habits by:

- Helping their child learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Ensuring their child arrives on time for the start of the school day, ready to participate in learning
- Reducing disruption to learning where possible, by planning any necessary appointments outside of school time
- Promptly communicating any absence to the school as soon as possible
- Working with the school to encourage and support regular attendance

Sometimes there are challenges to get students to attend school for a variety of reasons. Please get in touch with your child's class teacher, assistant principal or Ms Mayhew to discuss any concerns, we will work together to address them.



Absences

Students must attend school every day unless they are sick or for other special circumstances. If your child is absent from school, please record and explain the reason on SENTRAL. Absences can be explained on the day and should be explained by the time your child returns to school. Medical Certificates should be given to your child's teacher, please do not hand notes to the office.

For student absences greater than 10 school days parents are required to complete an Application for Extended Leave form prior to taking leave advising the school of the dates that the student will be away. This form needs to be completed in advance and approved by the Principal who will give a copy to the student's teacher. Travel documentation, such as plane tickets, should be attached. Please see our website for this form under notes or obtain a copy from the office.

SCHOOL DAY

Star Club - Out of School Hours Care (OSHC)

Our Out of School Hours Care service is provided onsite but independently run by Star Club and is separate from the school. Star Club also run a Vacation Care program onsite for students requiring care during the school holidays. Students must be enrolled with Star Club before a booking can be made. Please take a look at their website for more detail and enrolment forms.

Students arriving at school prior to 8:45am cannot be left in the playground unsupervised and must be booked and signed into Star Club. If you are unable to collect your child by 3.15pm you should book your child into Star Club.

All bookings, changes and cancellations for Out of School Hours Care should be done directly through Star Club.

COMMUNICATION

SENTRAL Parent Portal

Our school uses the online SENTRAL Parent Portal. Please download the App on your phone. SENTRAL offers parents an easy and convenient way to manage notes, permissions and make payments.

You can find information on the SENTRAL website at Sentral.com.au look under "Parents" and "How to get started". You can also look under "Portal & App Help" and click on the FAQs for more information.

Once your child is "enrolled in attendance", parents and carers will receive an email with a login Access Key and information about how to download the SENTRAL for Parents App. You can login with this Login Access Key and create a password. Don't worry if you do not have a smart phone/device the portal is available in a desktop version as well. If you want information on how to access SENTRAL on your laptop please contact the school.

All communication to parents and carers including sport, activities, excursions, notes, permissions to attend and student school reports will be sent via the SENTRAL Parent Portal. There are no paper notes or permissions except ones required by the department for example Choir Festival notes and PSSA Code of Conduct forms.

Parents will also be able to view and pay their child's fees via the SENTRAL Parent Portal. Please see more information below about fees. Please note that the Parent Portal cannot be used to pay for P&C costs such as uniforms or fundraising.

If you need any assistance with SENTRAL, please contact the school and we will arrange a mutually convenient time to assist you.



COMMUNICATION

School Newsletter

Our school newsletter informs parents, carers and our community about what is happening at our school each week.

Our newsletter is published weekly on SENTRAL and our school website by 4:00pm every Monday. We recommend that you read the newsletter so you are informed about current and future school activities, assemblies, awards, sport etc.

Emergency Contact Details

It is vital that the school office is updated with your current work, mobile, email and emergency contact details in case your child is unwell or injured. If your contact details have changed, please update them on SENTRAL. This will notify us and we will update our database accordingly. Alternatively, you can email the school with your change of contact details.

Court Orders

The principal and the class teacher must be informed of any special circumstances that may affect a student. If custody and access has been determined by court orders, then the original must be made available for our office to make a copy.

Health Care Plans

If your child has been diagnosed by a doctor with a health condition, including asthma or anaphylaxis, you will need to provide a current ASCIA Action Plan and medication to the school office. In addition, we ask that if your child requires Ventolin/EpiPen at school, it must be kept at the school office. These plans need to be updated annually.

Medication

Students are NOT permitted to bring any medication to school in their bag, including Panadol, Nurofen, cough syrup or anything else as this is against the Department of Education guidelines.

Allergy Awareness

Our school is 'Allergy Aware'. Please remember to avoid sending peanuts, tree nuts or any products to school where nuts are listed as ingredients eg Peanut Butter and Nutella. Also, to assist us in providing a safe environment for students with potential anaphylaxis, please ask your child not to share food. While nuts are the most publicised issue, there is also a range of other foods to which some of our students may react. For example, an allergy to shellfish may occur by eating something made with Oyster Sauce. Rather than have a long list of "banned" items, it is safer if all of our students only eat the food supplied by their own parents and carers.

COMMUNICATION

Three Way Conferences

During Semester 1 there will be an opportunity for all parents/carers to book an appointment with their child's teacher to discuss their child's learning. This meeting provides very valuable information to parents/carers and your attendance with your child is highly recommended.

Appointments with Teachers

Teachers are always the first point of contact if parents/carers have questions about their child's learning or would like an opportunity to talk about their child/home issues.

We ask that parents email the school at pagewood-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au to make an appointment. We endeavour to arrange a meeting as quickly as possible. Please note that teachers are sometimes unavailable before and after school due to school meetings, leadership meetings and professional development.



For urgent messages please always call the school office on 02 9316 9313. For non-urgent messages please email the school and our office will pass your message on to the teacher. The Principal is happy to meet with parents/carers, please call or email the school to make an appointment.



Student Reports on SENTRAL

Reports are published to the SENTRAL Portal twice yearly for parents to read. It is a great idea to download and save the PDF of the report in case you need it in the future.

Please note that when your child leaves PPS (in Year 6 or earlier) you will not have access to the reports so please download your reports.

AT SCHOOL

Uniforms

All students are expected to wear full school uniform, navy socks, fully black shoes (leather or sneaker style) and a school hat. Students are expected to wear their sport uniform on Fridays with black sport shoes and navy ankle socks. Summer uniform is worn during Terms 1 and 4 and winter uniform is worn during Terms 2 and 3. Our uniform shop is run by our P&C parent volunteers once a week. Please see our newsletter each Monday for Uniform Shop openina dates.The Uniform Shop available for purchases online. School Fees

Your child's fees will be submitted on the SENTRAL Parent Portal. The Voluntary Contribution is currently \$50 per child. Funds raised from these fees are put towards the purchase of essential resources such as paper, art and craft items, reading materials, technology etc. Payment of the Voluntary Contribution is a matter for decision by individual parents/carers. Our school would welcome your contribution as this will enhance the resources made available to all of our students.

Our school is cashless so all payments must be made using the SENTRAL Parent Portal. We appreciate some parents may wish to pay in instalments or may have difficulties meeting these costs. Please contact the Principal in confidence if you would like to discuss this matter.

Canteen

Our canteen is independently run off site by Botany Bites Catering who deliver lunches only on certain days. Botany Bites is a family run catering business based in Matraville who pride themselves on good wholesome homemade food. They are also Allergy Aware

and work with families to cater to student's dietary requirements. Canteen online orders are to be made by the 8.30am cut off using Flexischools. You will need to create an account with Flexischools. For cancellations, please call them by 9.00am to receive a credit. Please see our website under School Information / Canteen for details. GET INVOLVED

Assemblies

Assemblies are held in the school hall every second Wednesday afternoon (even weeks) at 2.30pm. There may be times that we begin assembly a bit earlier and this will be noted in the newsletter. Parents and carers are most welcome to attend especially when your child's class is presenting or when your child is receiving an award. Please move into the hall at the designated time, there are seats available at the back of the hall.

P&C (Parents and Citizens Association)

P&C meetings are held on the 1st Monday of each month at 7pm in the library and via Microsoft Teams. All community members are welcome. P&C Meetings are always noted in the newsletter. Parents are encouraged to attend these meetings to become more involved in what happens in our school. See our newsletter for details.



Parent/Carer Volunteers

If parents/carers or grandparents wish to volunteer at school, they are required to complete a digital declaration and provide Government approved photo ID as proof of identity to the office prior to volunteering at the school.

A Working With Children Check (WWCC) is NOT required for parent/carer volunteers.



SAFETY

Safety at School

We have guidelines to keep our students safe at school:

- All parents/carers, visitors and volunteers must sign in at our office.
- Book your child into Star Club before 8:45am and after 3:15pm for out of hours supervision.
- Parents/carers are not permitted to drive into the school grounds or carpark at any time.
- School areas are 40km zones so please drive slowly and be aware of children crossing roads who may not see your car.
- Please do not do a U-turn or 3 point turn in school zones as this puts children at risk.
- Use the Kiss and Ride area on Holloway Street safely and considerately, stay with your vehicle, obeying the rules.
- Please do not drop your child at the front gate in the "No Stopping" zone on Dalley Avenue.
- Parent/carers/visitors are NOT permitted to use the student toilets. You may use the adult toilet at the end of the library block.
- No parent/carer is permitted to speak with someone else's child in a disciplinary manner. Any difficulties with a child other than your own must be referred to a teacher.
- Bikes or scooters may be ridden to school. A helmet must be worn. A combination lock must be used on the bike racks located near Kiss and Ride.

When using the pedestrian crossing when the supervisor is on duty, please wait until
they have stopped the traffic before crossing.

- In accordance with the Companion Animals Act, dogs are NOT permitted on school property at any time, whether or not they are on a leash or tied up outside the school gate. Nor should dogs be brought to any school activity at another venue including sporting activities. Service dogs are welcome.
- Where there is a school crossing supervisor at a school crossing the following rules need to be enforced. Drivers must not proceed until the crossing supervisor's hand held sign is no longer displayed; or the crossing supervisor indicates that the motorist may proceed through the crossing.



SAFETY

Kiss and Ride Zone

Our Kiss and Ride Zone is located on Holloway Street. Kiss and Ride Zones are designed for the safety of all of our students and for your convenience. Designed for quick entry and exit, these zones minimise congestion and risk when used properly by all parents and carers. These zones operate under the same conditions as no parking zones, which means you may stop to drop off or pick up your child/ren for a maximum of 2 minutes and you are required to remain with your car.

Our main priority is the safety of all our students. It is very important that all parents, carers and grandparents follow the rules so that this zone is safe and effective for everyone. Students will be advised to stand away from the kerb, against the fence, and wait until their car is at the front of the zone before they proceed. If your child is not waiting, please drive around the block and return to the queue or park elsewhere and walk to collect them. Please do not do a U-turn or 3 point turn in school zones as this is extremely dangerous and puts children at risk.

Please note this zone will not be supervised by school staff but Council will be patrolling the area. Please respect the 2 minute timing and load bags straight into the car, not the boot, as this will speed up the process.

If you want to walk your child into school please park in the surrounding streets of our school and walk your child to school. Please do not park across driveways.

OTHER INFORMATION

Mobile Phones and Electronic Device Policy

Students are NOT permitted to use their mobile phone, smart watches or digital devices during school hours. They should remain in a student's bag at all times. Parents should note that secure storage of students' personal property is not available at this school. Students who bring mobile phones etc to school do so at their own risk and are responsible for their security.

Kindergarten Spare Clothes

Please pack spare underwear, shorts and socks in your child's bag in case of any toileting accidents at school. Please also let your child know that they have spare underwear and clothing in their bag.

Lost Property

Please clearly label all belongings for your child (including, hat, jacket, jumper, drink bottle, lunchbox etc) to minimise loss. Items found with no name will go to lost property. Lost property items can be found outside the Library.
