STUDENT REPORTS - ASSESSMENT AND REPORTING

Our student reports will contain information about each student according to the following guidelines:

- Schools will report on the key learning areas of English, mathematics, creative arts human society and its environment (which includes history and geography), personal development, health and physical education and science and technology.
- Students at Pagewood Ps are supported in the classroom and small groups with the EAL/D teachers.
- Reports will include teacher comments for each key learning area; comments will identify areas of student strength and areas for further development.
- Information about the student's attendance at school.
- Information about student achievement in relation to school programs that extend or are additional to syllabus requirements.
- You may request the school to provide you with written information that clearly shows your child's achievement compared to his or her peer group at school. This information will show you the number of children in the group in each of the achievement levels.
- Student achievement will be compared against state-wide syllabus standards through teacher comments in each key learning area for Kindergarten and a five point achievement scale for Years 1 to 10. Achievement is judged in relation to syllabus standards using the following scale.

A - Outstanding	The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.
B - High	The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.
C - Sound	The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.
D - Basic	The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a basic level of competence in the processes and skills.
E - Limited	The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING P&C FUNDED BAND INSTRUMENTS

Pagewood Public School will no longer be supplying instruments for students to hire. The cost of maintaining instruments (annual service fees in the hundreds of dollars per instrument) as well as the huge investment of time spent administering the hire system have led to this decision.

Next year all members of the band will need to hire through an external source, such as DIM, or buy their own instruments.

The P&C purchased a large number of instruments, some as far back as 1994, some more recently in 2011. All these instruments will be offered for sale to the school community. The condition of instruments cannot be guaranteed- they have been in constant use for a minimum of 8 years, all purchases are at the buyers own risk.

Once the instruments are ready for sale, further details will be sent out to the school community on how you can purchase one of these instruments.
