### **'TELL THEM FROM ME' YEARS 4 - 6**

This term our school, like many other public schools in NSW, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

The survey is a great opportunity for our Year 4 – 6 students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used *Tell Them From Me* to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

The survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 20 March and 12 April. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

A consent form and FAQs for parents/carers about the survey is being sent home with students. ### **NAPLAN – NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM LITERACY AND NUMERACY**



In Term 2 Year 3 and 5 students will participate in NAPLAN online between Tuesday 14 and Friday 24 May. It is most likely that Year 5 will complete NAPLAN in Week 3 between Tuesday 14 – Thursday 16 May and Year 3 will complete NAPLAN in Week 4 between Monday 20 – Wednesday 22 May.

This year all students at Pagewood PS will participate in the online format of NAPLAN.

Year 3 students will not be completing the writing component online, rather it will be a handwritten sample. All students in these years have been given a printed 'Information for Parents' sheet today. Please read the information and contact your child's classroom teacher or Mrs Arthur (Year 3) or Miss Cianciolo (Year 5) if you have any further questions.

The school is currently ensuring all devices that will be used meet the required specifications and that students are familiar with the test format. All students will require headphones to wear during the assessments. Between 25 March and 5 April students will participate in an 'omnibus' test which will provide a sample of the test format and how to log on correctly. The link below will take you to demonstration tests for conventions of language (grammar, punctuation, and spelling), numeracy, reading and writing for each NAPLAN test year level: 3, 5, 7 and 9. As all Year 3 students will complete the writing test on paper, there is no Year 3 demonstration test for writing. ### **YEAR 6-7 TRANSITION TO HIGH SCHOOL EXPRESSION OF INTEREST**

Please ensure completed forms are given to your child's class teacher by **tomorrow (Tuesday 19 March)**. The next step is that all information is collated and forwarded to either your child's local high school for transition organisation or if you have indicated on the form that your child will be attending a non-government school this information will be stored so there is a record of which school your child will be attending in 2020.

## HARMONY DAY

## KISS AND RIDE ZONE

Our Kiss and Ride zone is up and running. Kiss and Ride zones are designed for your convenience and for your child's safety. Designed for quick entry and exit, these zones minimise congestion and risk when used properly by all parents and carers. These zones operate under the same conditions as no parking zones, which means you may stop to drop off or pick up children for a **maximum of 2 minutes**. The driver is required to remain in the vehicle. The gate next to the Kiss and Ride zone will be open from 8:00am-9:30am and 3:00pm-4:00pm each day.



The Kiss and Ride Zone Rules are on page 6. It is very important that all parents and carers follow these rules to ensure that this zone is safe and effective for everyone. Our main priority is the safety of all our students. If grandparents or carers will be using this zone can you please give them a copy of the rules so they are aware of the system in place.

Students will be advised to stand back against the fence, away from the kerb, and wait until their car is in the zone before they proceed. If your child is not waiting, please do a loop and return to the queue or park legally and walk to collect them.

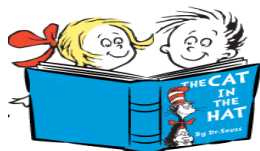
**Please DO NOT double park or do a U-turn as this is illegal and places children at risk.**

Please note this zone will not be supervised by school staff. Please respect the timing and sequence, load children and their bags straight into the car, not the boot, which will avoid exiting the vehicle and speed up the process. Council will be patrolling the area to supervise this zone.

**ASSEMBLY** - Assembly will be held on Wednesday 20 March at **2.30pm**. Library Monitor badges will be presented and the Choir will perform a song. Parents/Carers/grandparents are most welcome to attend our assemblies. You do not need to sign in at the office for assembly, just take a seat in the hall.

#### UNIFORM SHOP

Our lovely parent volunteers will open the uniform shop on **Thursday 28 March at 9.15am**. Uniform orders can be left at the office at any time with correct money. # KISS AND RIDE ZONES

## Understanding the rules

**Kiss and Ride zones are for your child's safety, your convenience and to minimise congestion and confusion**

### RULES

- Kiss and Ride zones and 'No Parking' zones operate under the same conditions – may stop to drop off or pick up children for a maximum of 2 minutes.
- Driver must remain in or within 3 metres of vehicle.
- Zone applies only during hours of operation.



### REMEMBER

- **DO NOT LEAVE YOUR VEHICLE:** to assist with traffic flow, drivers should remain in the car whilst children get in and out. Children should travel with bags in the car (not in the boot).
- **BE TIMELY:** if your child does not get in or out of the vehicle within 2 minutes, you must leave and re-enter the No Parking zone.
- **STAY IN SEQUENCE:** don't cut in the queue. Drop off or pick-up your child close to the top of the zone, allowing vehicles following you to enter the zone in an orderly manner.
- **CHILD SAFETY:** please ensure children get in or out of the vehicle on the kerb side. The back seat is the safest seat for children to travel in, regardless of the make of vehicle. Ensure children have their restraints securely fastened before driving off.
- **NO U-TURNS:** Do not make u-turns in busy school zones. They are dangerous and put children at risk. Fines and demerit points apply.

**Kiss and Ride Zones need cooperation to ensure the safety of all children. Please drive carefully around school zones.**

## DOUBLE PARKING

Do not double park at any time. Double parking is illegal and dangerous especially around schools. It reduces visibility and blocks the road for other motorists.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$337 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS**

## U TURNS

- ▶ Performing U turns or 3 point turns in school zones is extremely dangerous.
- ▶ Performing U turns across unbroken centre lines is illegal and is particularly dangerous around schools.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$337 + 3 DEMERIT POINTS**

## PARKING/STOPPING NEAR INTERSECTIONS

It is illegal to park or stop less than 10m from an intersection without lights as this blocks visibility for turning drivers and creates a hazard for all motorists.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$448 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS**

## PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS & CHILDREN'S CROSSINGS

- ▶ Slow down as you approach pedestrian crossings and children's crossings.
- ▶ Do not proceed if the road beyond the crossing is blocked.
- ▶ Do not stop or park in the No Stopping zones on either side of the crossing as this blocks visibility.
- ▶ At a children's crossing you must stop at or before the stop line if there is a pedestrian about to cross or already on the crossing.
- ▶ Do not proceed through a children's crossing until all pedestrians have completely cleared the crossing.

## HOLDING HANDS IN TRAFFIC!

- ▶ Children need assistance in the traffic environment until at least the age of 10. They are not equipped physically or developmentally to make the crucial decisions to keep themselves safe.
- ▶ All children need to be actively supervised in and around moving vehicles including on footpaths, shared paths, driveways and car parks; at traffic lights, zebra and other road crossings; and on quiet streets and busy roads.
- ▶ Your children are always watching and want to be just like adults. Make sure you always set a good example around traffic and talk to your children about why you are stopping at the kerb and what you are watching and listening for. Explain where and when it is safe to cross and why.
- ▶ Hold hands with your children around traffic. If your hands are full, make sure your child holds onto your bag, pram or even your arm or sleeve.

*Fines and demerit points for school parking infringements are determined by the State Government and subject to change.*

# PARKING SAFELY AROUND SCHOOLS

## Road Rules Reminders

## NO STOPPING ZONES

No Stopping signs mean you must not stop here at any time. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times.

An unbroken yellow kerb line is a no stopping line. You must not stop for any reason.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$337 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS**



## BUS ZONE SIGNS

A Bus Zone is a No Stopping zone for vehicles other than buses. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times.

You must not park your vehicle less than 20 metres before or 10 metres after a bus stop.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$337 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS**



## NO PARKING ZONES

You can only stop in a No Parking zone while picking up or setting down passengers or goods. You have a maximum of 2 minutes from the time you stop and must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle at all times. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times. **THIS IS NOT A WAITING ZONE.**

**FINE EXCEEDS \$187 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS**



## TIME RESTRICTED PARKING

Parking signs with specified time limits allow drivers to park their vehicle for a maximum period of time, eg 5 minutes, 1 hour etc. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times.

## DRIVEWAYS AND FOOTPATHS

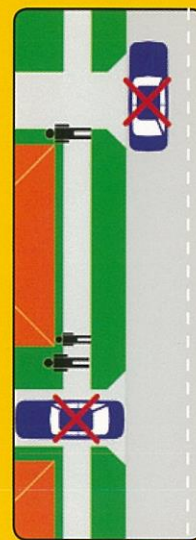
When exiting or entering a driveway a vehicle must give way to pedestrians on the footpath.

Driveways are not playgrounds. Be aware that children can go unnoticed in front and behind your vehicle. Do not solely rely on reverse sensors or cameras in your vehicle.

Always supervise and hold a child's hand near/crossing driveways.

It is illegal to park in or across any driveway or to block a footpath at any time.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$337 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS**



## USING MOBILE PHONES

It is illegal to make or receive a call on your mobile phone while you are driving unless your phone is secured in a fixed mounting or does not require you to touch or manipulate the phone in any way.

It is illegal to use the other features of a mobile phone such as texting, emailing etc unless your car is legally parked and the ignition is switched off.

Using mobile phones is a major distraction for drivers and incurs higher fines and demerit points in school zones.
