## OPPORTUNITY CLASS PLACEMENTS

Opportunity classes cater for academically gifted and talented students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level. Applications for opportunity class placement are considered mainly on the combined results of the Opportunity Class Placement Test and school assessments. The Opportunity Class Placement Test will be held on Wednesday 31 July 2019.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 5 opportunity class entry in 2020, you need to apply soon. You will need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address). An information sheet has been sent home today with all Year 4 students.

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available from Tuesday 30 April 2019 at <https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-5>

The application website opens on Tuesday 30 April 2019 and closes on Friday 17 May 2019. You must apply online by the due date. There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the school for assistance after 30 April 2019. You must submit only ONE application for each student.

## STATEMENT OF ACCOUNT

A reminder that your child's 'Statement of Account' for Term 1 is now overdue. Payment of this account at your earliest convenience would be appreciated. Parents are encouraged to pay all fees if possible before the Term 2 Statement of Account is sent home next term. Payments can still be accepted over the holidays.

To pay your child's 'Statement of Account', it is helpful to the school if Parents and Carers use the Parent Online Payment (POP) system. This is to reduce the amount of cash being handled at school by students and staff. To pay by POP, please go to the Pagewood Public School website at <http://www.pagewood-p.schools.nsw.edu.au> and select 'Make a payment'. Parents and Carers are welcome to pay for two or more children in one payment.

I appreciate some parents may wish to pay in instalments or may have difficulties meeting these costs. Please contact Ms Mayhew in confidence if you would like to discuss this matter.

## MAKING PAYMENTS ON-LINE FROM HOME

Parents can make online payments to the school, via a secure payment page hosted by Westpac. **This is our preferred method of payment.** The payment page is accessed from the front page of the school's website: <http://www.pagewood-p.schools.nsw.edu.au/> by selecting **\$ Make a payment**. Please note that this facility **cannot** be used to pay for the Canteen or P&C costs such as Uniforms or fundraising. To assist you, future notes for excursions, shows, etc will make reference to the on-line payment option.

When using **\$ Make a payment** you must enter:

- **student's name**
- **class**
- students **date of birth**
- **Please tick** what you are paying for (eg. voluntary contribution, sport, band, other, etc)
- **\$ Amount**

**This is a secure payment system hosted by Westpac to ensure that your credit/debit card details are captured in a secure manner. These details are not passed back to the school.**

## FRONT OFFICE NEW ENTRANCE

The finishing touches are being placed on the new entrance to the school during school hours. Once the gates are ready, at 9:30am each morning the Page St and usual pedestrian entrances will be locked. Entry to the school will be via the new gate which is located 10m from the usual pedestrian gate near the front office. This will ensure anyone who enters the school during school hours will have to come through the front office. The area will get a make-over during Term 2 with new plants. Next term we will be asking for input from students and parents as to how we can improve the appearance and functionality of the front office area. There will be a group of students from Stage 2 working with Ms Mayhew on this project.

## **School Crossing Supervisors – Work with your community 1x Casual positions - Botany Bay Local Government Area (00006XT7)**

An important person in a child's school life is the School Crossing Supervisor, who ensures they cross the road safely. The role requires minimal hours out of your day and gives something worthwhile back to the community.

The hours are usually 8.00am to 9.30am and/or 2.30pm to 4.00pm Monday to Friday during school terms. You may be required to work morning, afternoon, both shifts and no shifts. As a casual you will be filling in for existing part-time staff as required. The base rate is \$23.02 - \$27.62 per hour.

All the qualifications you need are community spirit, good communication skills, an alert and professional attitude to work and a reliable personality. The casual hours and school holidays would suit a parent or grandparent, a retiree or anyone wanting meaningful work — but not full-time.

Training for your key responsibilities of directing traffic to stop at the designated crossing and giving clear instructions to infants and primary school students to cross the road safely, will be provided. You may be required to attend a health assessment. Appointment is subject to a Working with Children Check clearance.



## PARKING/STOPPING NEAR INTERSECTIONS

It is illegal to park or stop less than 10m from an intersection without lights as this blocks visibility for turning drivers and creates a hazard for all motorists.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$448 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS**

## PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS & CHILDREN'S CROSSINGS

- ▶ Slow down as you approach pedestrian crossings and children's crossings.
- ▶ Do not proceed if the road beyond the crossing is blocked.
- ▶ Do not stop or park in the No Stopping zones on either side of the crossing as this blocks visibility.
- ▶ At a children's crossing you must stop at or before the stop line if there is a pedestrian about to cross or already on the crossing.
- ▶ Do not proceed through a children's crossing until all pedestrians have completely cleared the crossing.

## HOLDING HANDS IN TRAFFIC!

- ▶ Children need assistance in the traffic environment until at least the age of 10. They are not equipped physically or developmentally to make the crucial decisions to keep themselves safe.
- ▶ All children need to be actively supervised in and around moving vehicles including on footpaths, shared paths, driveways and car parks; at traffic lights, zebra and other road crossings; and on quiet streets and busy roads.
- ▶ Your children are always watching and want to be just like adults. Make sure you always set a good example around traffic and talk to your children about why you are stopping at the kerb and what you are watching and listening for. Explain where and when it is safe to cross and why.
- ▶ Hold hands with your children around traffic. If your hands are full, make sure your child holds onto your bag, pram or even your arm or sleeve.

## NO STOPPING ZONES

No Stopping signs mean you must not stop here at any time. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times.

An unbroken yellow kerb line is a no stopping line. You must not stop for any reason.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$337 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS**



## BUS ZONE SIGNS

A Bus Zone is a No Stopping zone for vehicles other than buses. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times.

You must not park your vehicle less than 20 metres before or 10 metres after a bus stop.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$337 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS**



## NO PARKING ZONES

You can only stop in a No Parking zone while picking up or setting down passengers or goods. You have a maximum of 2 minutes from the time you stop and must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle at all times. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times. **THIS IS NOT A WAITING ZONE.**

**FINE EXCEEDS \$187 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS**



## TIME RESTRICTED PARKING

Parking signs with specified time limits allow drivers to park their vehicle for a maximum period of time, eg 5 minutes, 1 hour etc. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$112**



## DRIVEWAYS AND FOOTPATHS


When exiting or entering a driveway a vehicle must give way to pedestrians on the footpath.

Driveways are not playgrounds. Be aware that children can go unnoticed in front and behind your vehicle. Do not solely rely on reverse sensors or cameras in your vehicle.

Always supervise and hold a child's hand near/crossing driveways.

It is illegal to park in or across any driveway or to block a footpath at any time.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$337 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS**



## USING MOBILE PHONES

It is illegal to make or receive a call on your mobile phone while you are driving unless your phone is secured in a fixed mounting or does not require you to touch or manipulate the phone in any way.

It is illegal to use the other features of a mobile phone such as texting, emailing etc unless your car is legally parked and the ignition is switched off.

Using mobile phones is a major distraction for drivers and incurs higher fines and demerit points in school zones.
