PARENT – TEACHER – STUDENT

MEETINGS During Week 10 there will be an opportunity for parents and students to meet with their class teacher. The purpose of the meeting is to discuss student learning and progress both academically and socially. Ten minutes will be allocated for each family. This is a wonderful opportunity to discuss your child's report which will be sent home this Friday 28 June and ask any questions you may have. ASSESSMENT AND REPORTING

Our student reports will contain information about each student according to the following guidelines:

- Schools will report on the key learning areas of English, mathematics, creative arts human society and its environment (which includes history and geography), personal development, health and physical education and science and technology.
- Schools will report on the overall English as an additional language or dialect (EAL/D) progression phase of all students identified as EAL/D. Schools will report on how EAL/D students' English language learning has been supported and their progress in learning English. Students are identified according to the information provided on their enrolment form. Students at Pagewood Ps are supported in the classroom and small groups with the EAL/D teachers.
- Reports will include teacher comments for each key learning area; comments will identify areas of student strength and areas for further development.
- Information about the student's attendance at school.
- Information about student achievement in relation to school programs that extend or are additional to syllabus requirements.
- You may request the school to provide you with written information that clearly shows your child's achievement compared to his or her peer group at school. This information will show you the number of children in the group in each of the achievement levels.
- Student achievement will be compared against state-wide syllabus standards through teacher comments in each key learning area for Kindergarten and a five point achievement scale for Years 1 to 10. Achievement is judged in relation to syllabus standards using the following scale.

A - Outstanding	The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.
B - High	The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.
C - Sound	The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.
D - Basic	The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a basic level of competence in the processes and skills.
E - Limited	The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

NATIONALLY CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA (NCCD)

On 10 May 2013, all Education Ministers from Commonwealth, state and territory governments endorsed the implementation of a Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) in all Australian schools. The nationally consistent approach to data collection provides all Australian schools, education authorities and the community with a clear picture of the number of students receiving educational adjustments because of disability in schools, and the levels of adjustment they are provided to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students.

The Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) defines disability broadly, including:

- total or partial loss of the person's bodily or mental functions or
- total or partial loss of a part of the body or
- the presence in the body of organisms causing disease or illness or
- the presence in the body of organisms capable of causing disease or illness or
- the malfunction, malformation or disfigurement of a part of the person's body or
- a disorder or malfunction that results in the person learning differently from a person without the disorder or malfunction or
- a disorder, illness or disease that affects a person's thought processes, perception of reality, emotions or judgment or that results in disturbed behaviour

Please read the document from the NCCD attached to this email for more information about the upcoming data collection taking place in our school.
