ASSESSMENT AND REPORTING

Our student reports will contain information about each student according to the following guidelines which have been revised due to Learning from home. Schools will need to consider their context when making decisions about how they report on student learning progress in Semester 1. It is important to acknowledge that all students may not have covered the same outcomes or content. Approaches to reporting may also vary for year groups within a school.

All schools will:

- provide a simplified written report in an accessible form that is easy for parents/carers to understand
- describe a summative account of student progress and achievement on the learning covered during
 Semester 1
- provide information about student attendance and commitment to learning.

In addition, principals will have flexibility to:

- modify their existing reporting templates/software to meet new requirements
- develop a new simplified report
- provide written reports on Semesters 1 learning up to 30 August 2020
- prioritise reporting for specific grades or students in the first instance
- continue to use the A-E scale where valid assessment judgements can be made

At the end of 2019 Pagewood PS staffed reviewed the reporting format and selected the assessment criteria for every grade for each semester to be reported on rather than written text. We hope this will help parents, carers and students identify specific criteria achievement. The number of assessment criteria in English and mathematics has been reduced for this semester only.

Your child's level of achievement has been assessed in English and Mathematics against a set of assessment criteria relevant to year level and academic development. Other Key Learning areas will be included for Semester 2. For Semester 1, a description of student learning has been included. 'Where to next' statements for English and mathematics provide information as to future directions for your child's learning i.e. what they need to do next, based on their individual needs. These will increase to five for Semester 2. We look forward to your feedback about the new report format.

Achievement

Students in Kindergarten who are achieving at grade level i.e. where they should be at this stage of their learning, are defined as 'Expected Level'. Students working above expected grade level receive 'Working Beyond' whilst those who aren't yet achieving at expected grade level receive "Working Towards'.

For students in Years 1-6, achievement is measured against the achievement of syllabus outcomes using what is called the 'common grade scale'. The same scale is used in public schools across NSW. Students who are achieving at grade level i.e. where they should be at this stage of their learning, are defined as 'Sound'.

A - Outstanding	The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.
B - High	The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.
C - Sound	The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.
D - Basic	The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a basic level of competence in the processes and skills.
E - Limited	The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

NATIONALLY CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA (NCCD)

On 10 May 2013, all Education Ministers from Commonwealth, state and territory governments endorsed the implementation of a Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) in all Australian schools. The nationally consistent approach to data collection provides all Australian schools, education authorities and the community with a clear picture of the number of students receiving educational adjustments because of disability in schools, and the levels of adjustment they are provided to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students.

The Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) defines disability broadly, including:

- · total or partial loss of the person's bodily or mental functions or
- · total or partial loss of a part of the body or
- · the presence in the body of organisms causing disease or illness or
- the presence in the body of organisms capable of causing disease or illness or
- the malfunction, malformation or disfigurement of a part of the person's body or
- · a disorder or malfunction that results in the person learning differently from a person without the disorder or malfunction or
- · a disorder, illness or disease that affects a person's thought processes, perception of reality, emotions or judgment or that results in disturbed behaviour.

Our school is currently reviewing the relevant data for collection.

NITS

There have been cases of nits reported at our school. This is a timely reminder for parents to please check their childrens hair for nits during the holidays using the methods recommended in information from NSW Health http://www.health.nsw.gov.au/environment/headlice/Pages/treatment.aspx

If you find any eggs or nits please treat your child with a head lice preparation and again in seven days to break the cycle. I appreciate parental assistance in this matter.

ARRIVING EARLY

It is important that children do not arrive at school until 8.45am unless they are enrolled in Before School Care. If a child does come before 8.45am, they must be accompanied by an adult who is able to stay with them until 8.45am. Any student who does arrive prior without an adult will be asked to sit outside the front office. This is important for the safety of children as there are no teachers on duty until 8.45am. Thank you.

STATEMENT OF ACCOUNT

Statement of Accounts have now been sent home to all families with outstanding expenses. Our preferred method to pay your child's 'Statement of Account' is for Parents and Carers to use the Parent Online Payment (POP) system. This is to reduce the amount of cash being handled at school by the office, students and staff. If you wish to pay by cash, please send cash payments to your child's teacher **on Tuesday only.**
