SAFETY AT SCHOOL - NO KNIVES AT SCHOOL

As a result of a recent high school incident, principals have been asked to provide information to parents and carers of the current policy. Parents and students need to know that NO knives of any kind can be brought to school, they are prohibited. NSW now has the toughest laws in Australia. As a parent, you need to be aware of these laws, as you can be charged if you allow your child to carry a knife. Please see the factsheet at the end of the newsletter.

SMILING MIND



Attached to the newsletter email this week is an overview of our Pagewood PS Smiling Mind Program.

In 2020 the parents and carers of our students completed a *Tell Them From Me* survey where we sort suggestions for future focus in student wellbeing and learning. In following up your recommendations and requests the school has researched and pursued training in the wellbeing program Smiling Mind. Two staff members were trained to lead the implementation of the program. All staff were trained in teaching the program. An Action Team of eleven staff members have been working behind the scenes to prepare the teaching and learning resources and to link the program to our Pagewood PS Personal Development, Health and Physical Education Scope and Sequence.

The first attachment is a Parent Guide to the program which has been produced by Smiling Mind. It provides the philosophy of the program, research behind the program, details about accessing the app and how families at home can utilise the work completed at school. In the information provided it discusses the homework the students are required to complete as part of the program. The Action Team has decided to complete the homework journal at school in 2021 rather than at home so that we as a staff can thoroughly evaluate the program.

The second attachment is an overview of the twenty topics of the program covered in a calendar year. Each topic is being covered over a two-week cycle. If you ask your child they should be able to tell you which topic they are covering in class so that you as a family can utilise the corresponding resources on the Smiling Mind App. Otherwise just start at the first topic and make your way through at your own pace.

FACTSHEET

No knives at school – parent factsheet

Health and Safety Directorate



There is no good reason to bring a knife to school

NSW now has the toughest knife laws in Australia. As a parent, you need to be aware of these laws, as you can also be charged if you allow your child to carry a knife.

No knives allowed at school under any circumstances

If a student has a knife at school the principal may call the police.

The student may be expelled or suspended immediately. Possessing a knife includes your child simply having one in their bag or locker. Having a knife for self-protection is also illegal. If you are concerned about your child's wellbeing or safety, contact the principal.

Tough penalties apply for children convicted of knife offences, including gaol sentences of up to 25 years if someone is injured with a knife during an assault.

Every child has the right to feel safe and secure at school. There is no good reason for a child to ever have a knife at school.

If you want to talk about children and knives at school, please contact the principal.

What kind of knives are prohibited?

As school policy is designed to keep all students safe, no type of knife is allowed at school. That means no butter knives or fruit knives in lunchboxes, or knife tools for craft purposes.

Flick knives, ballistic knives, sheath knives, push daggers, trench knives, butterfly knives and star knives are all prohibited

Your child cannot bring to school any item that can be used as a weapon (such as a chisel).

In lessons requiring the use of knives, for example cooking or trades, your child's teacher will supply and supervise the use of the tools. There are some senior subjects, such as hospitality, where children may be required to have their own knives.

Your child's school will advise you about these courses and the procedures for carrying knives legally to and from school

The law makes parents responsible

You need to make certain your child is aware of the school's rules and the State laws about knives.

If you allow your child to carry or possess a knife at school or in a public place, you can be charged.

The police can search any child they suspect of having a knife. They can confiscate any dangerous object they might find during the search.

Your child must comply with such a police search, or they may be arrested and charged.

It is also illegal for anyone to sell a knife to anyone who is less than 18 years old
