UPGRADE TO THE PARENT ONLINE PAYMENTS (POP) PAGE

The upgraded POP page replaces the old Westpac page. It's accessible from the school's website and allows parents and carers to make online payments anywhere and anytime. By using the upgraded page, parents and carers will enjoy:

- a quick and simple user interface;
- mobile-friendly experience – making it easier to pay via phone or tablet (as well as from a desktop computer); and
- multilingual support which enables them to use POP in their preferred language.
- Easily without needing to log on, register or enter a Student Registration Number.
- Check your email for a copy of your receipt

The anticipated increase in online payments will help to relieve the administrative burden on teachers and office staff. Additionally, schools will benefit from improved data quality, with the POP upgrades making it easier to reconcile payments with individual students. Please see **pages 10 and 11**, only those details with red asterisk need to be provided to school. On our website, go to "Make a Payment" and enter your child's details.

STATEMENT OF ACCOUNT

A reminder that your child's 'Statement of Account' for Term 1 is now overdue. Payment of this account at your earliest convenience would be appreciated. Parents are encouraged to pay all fees if possible before the Term 2 Statement of Account is sent home next term. Payments can still be accepted over the holidays. Please have a look at our new Parent Online Payment (POP) system on our website under 'Make a Payment'. The School Voluntary Contribution is \$50. This is a voluntary payment to the school.

Please note that this facility is to pay for expenses on your Statement of Account only, it **cannot** be used to pay for the Canteen or P&C costs such as Uniforms or fundraising. The new payment instructions are on pages 11 and 12. This is a secure payment system to ensure that your credit/debit card details are captured in a secure manner. Your card details are not passed back to the school.

WE ARE WORKING TOWARDS A CASH FREE SCHOOL

We are planning to be a 'cash free' school from Term 2. Therefore, we encourage parents and carers to become familiar with and use our **new** Parent Online Payment (POP) system to work towards this goal and minimise disruptions to class time.

When paying by cash, this is collected by the student's teachers which does interrupt valuable lesson time. We would like to minimise the interruptions in class by working towards a cash free payment system in the near future where everyone pays online. There are many schools who have already put this system into place.

TERM 2 - WINTER SPORT TRIALS

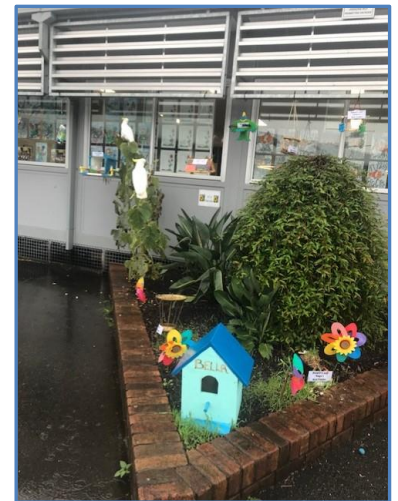
