

TELL THEM FROM ME SURVEY

This term, our school is taking part in the *Tell Them From Me* student survey. The survey will provide us with valuable feedback on what our students think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them.

The survey is run by an independent research company, The Learning Bar, which specialises in school-based surveys. This survey is **confidential**, and staff in schools will **not** be able to identify individual students from their responses.

To ensure confidentiality, participating students will receive a unique username and password. Information is only reported where five or more students answer a question.

The survey is online, takes approximately 30 minutes, and will take place at school during school hours. We will receive a report on our school's survey results shortly after our students complete the survey.

Participating in the survey is **voluntary**. If any survey questions make your child uncomfortable, your child can skip the question or can choose to stop the survey at any time.



What to do each day

- Drop off/pick up your child via the Page St gate. There is a sign at the gate with a phone number if the gate is unattended

- Adhere to our health policy by keeping unwell children at home

Health & Additional Needs:

- Anticipated # of children is 60-120 and # of staff is 6-12.
