The Pagewood PS P&C meeting is being held tonight in person or online. Our P&C meetings are an opportunity to meet other parents and carers, hear about what is happening in the school and contribute your ideas to our school learning community. I hope to see you there!

It is always a highlight for me to meet individually with the prospective Year 6 student leaders each year. Last week I had the pleasure of discussing their strengths as a leader and what they would bring to the team next year. All twenty students spoke very well and had great ideas to make our school an even better learning environment. They are now preparing their speeches and 'campaign' posters.



This Wednesday we are so excited to welcome our new Kindergarten 2025 students and families for their first Transition Day. There will be a short presentation and time for the 'new students' to meet their older buddy and spend time in the classrooms. Welcome!

Last week the NSW Department of Education advised schools that there will now be four School Development Days (SDD) at the beginning of each school year in government schools. This time will allow teachers and school staff to engage in mandatory professional learning, school based professional learning as well as plan and prepare for the coming school year at PPS. In 2025 all students from Kindergarten to Year 6 at PPS will begin school on **Thursday 6 February**. The updated dates are noted in this newsletter. Additional SDD are scheduled for Term 2 (Monday 28 and Tuesday 28 April), Term 3 (Monday 21 July) and Term 4 (Monday 13 October).

This week a print letter will be sent home with your child asking whether they will be returning to PPS in 2025 and for any additional information regarding your child. If you intend moving out of the area and school, please advise the school via this form. This information assists in the appropriate staffing of the school as well as class formations. Please complete and return the form to your child's teacher or the school office by Friday 22 November.

I will be taking Leave for two weeks, beginning next week. Ms Best will relieve as principal for both weeks. 4CL will be taught by Mrs Lucas for both weeks except for one day.

The NSWDoE is implementing changes to the application and placement process for both selective high schools (SHS) and opportunity classes (OC) to deliver benefits for schools, students, parents and carers. Tests will mostly be hosted in external centres, reducing the burden on schools, and conducted on computers

delivering a more engaging experience for students. We are also introducing a longer application period for parents and carers to apply. Outcomes will be released earlier. This means that the application period for both OC and SHS is now the same and will run from 7 November 2024 to 21 February 2025. ## ES (EASTERN SUBURBS) PSSA CODE OF CONDUCT

The following information regarding the PSSA Code of Conduct is for parents and carers who attend PSSA games and carnivals. Students who are selected to represent Pagewood PS will be given a copy of the Players' Code of Conduct. Further information is available at <http://easternsuburbs.sessazones.com/codes-of-conduct/>

Codes of Behaviour provide a supportive framework which promotes fair play and appropriate behaviour in school sport. These codes apply to players, teachers, coaches, principals, parents, officials and spectators who together provide the environment in which school sport is played. The following Codes apply to school sport at all levels and are designed to highlight:



- The principles of enjoyment, satisfaction and safe play in sport
- That students participate for their own sake and not to fulfil the desires of parents, adult groups or peers
- The encouragement of student participation in sport and, in so doing, contribute to higher levels of health and physical fitness.

## PARENTS' CODE

- Encourage your child to always play by the rules.
- If children are interested in sport, encourage them to participate. Refrain from forcing an unwilling child to participate.
- Remember that children participate in organised school sports for their enjoyment and fulfilment, not yours.
- Teach your child that honest effort is as important as winning so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
- Encourage your child to work towards skill improvement. Never ridicule your child for making a mistake or losing a competition.
- Always encourage the principle of good sportsmanship.
- Children learn best by example. Applaud good play by all individuals and all teams.
- Do not publicly question the officials' judgement and never their honesty.
- Appreciate the contribution and commitment of teachers in coaching positions. They give their time and resources to provide sporting activities for your child and deserve your support.
- Have realistic expectations for your child and her or his team. Do not expect more than they can give.
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities. Condemn the use of violence in any form.

## WHOOPING COUGH

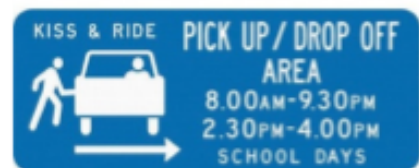
# KISS AND RIDE ZONES

## Understanding the rules

**Kiss and Ride zones are for your child's safety, your convenience and to minimise congestion and confusion**

### RULES

- Kiss and Ride zones and 'No Parking' zones operate under the same conditions – may stop to drop off or pick up children for a maximum of 2 minutes.
- Driver must remain in or within 3 metres of vehicle.
- Zone applies only during hours of operation.



### REMEMBER

- **DO NOT LEAVE YOUR VEHICLE:** to assist with traffic flow, drivers should remain in the car whilst children get in and out. Children should travel with bags in the car (not in the boot).
- **BE TIMELY:** if your child does not get in or out of the vehicle within 2 minutes, you must leave and re-enter the No Parking zone.
- **STAY IN SEQUENCE:** don't cut in the queue. Drop off or pick-up your child close to the top of the zone, allowing vehicles following you to enter the zone in an orderly manner.
- **CHILD SAFETY:** please ensure children get in or out of the vehicle on the kerb side. The back seat is the safest seat for children to travel in, regardless of the make of vehicle. Ensure children have their restraints securely fastened before driving off.
- **NO U-TURNS:** Do not make u-turns in busy school zones. They are dangerous and put children at risk. Fines and demerit points apply.

**Kiss and Ride Zones need cooperation to ensure the safety of all children. Please drive carefully around school zones.**



## DOUBLE PARKING

Do not double park at any time. Double parking is illegal and dangerous especially around schools. It reduces visibility and blocks the road for other motorists.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$344 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS**

## U TURNS

- ▶ Performing U turns or 3 point turns in school zones is extremely dangerous.
- ▶ Performing U turns across unbroken centre lines is illegal and is particularly dangerous around schools.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$344 + 3 DEMERIT POINTS**

## PARKING/STOPPING NEAR INTERSECTIONS

It is illegal to park or stop less than 10m from an intersection without lights as this blocks visibility for turning drivers and creates a hazard for all motorists.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$457 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS**

## PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS & CHILDREN'S CROSSINGS

- ▶ Slow down as you approach pedestrian crossings and children's crossings.
- ▶ Do not proceed if the road beyond the crossing is blocked.
- ▶ Do not stop or park in the No Stopping zones on either side of the crossing as this blocks visibility.
- ▶ At a children's crossing you must stop at or before the stop line if there is a pedestrian about to cross or already on the crossing.
- ▶ Do not proceed through a children's crossing until all pedestrians have completely cleared the crossing.

# PARKING SAFELY AROUND SCHOOLS

## Road Rules Reminders

### HOLDING HANDS IN TRAFFIC

- ▶ Children need assistance in the traffic environment until at least the age of 10. They are not equipped physically or developmentally to make the crucial decisions to keep themselves safe.
- ▶ All children need to be actively supervised in and around moving vehicles including on footpaths, shared paths, driveways and car parks; at traffic lights, zebra and other road crossings; and on quiet streets and busy roads.
- ▶ Your children are always watching and want to be just like adults. Make sure you always set a good example around traffic and talk to your children about why you are stopping at the kerb and what you are watching and listening for. Explain where and when it is safe to cross and why.
- ▶ Hold hands with your children around traffic. If your hands are full, make sure your child holds onto your bag, pram or even your arm or sleeve.

*Fines and demerit points for school parking infringements are determined by the State Government and subject to change.*

## NO STOPPING ZONES

No Stopping signs mean you must not stop here at any time. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times.

An unbroken yellow kerb line is a no stopping line. You must not stop for any reason.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$344 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS**



## BUS ZONE SIGNS

A Bus Zone is a No Stopping zone for vehicles other than buses. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times.

You must not park your vehicle less than 20 metres before or 10 metres after a bus stop.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$344 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS**



## NO PARKING ZONES

You can only stop in a No Parking zone while picking up or setting down passengers or goods. You have a maximum of 2 minutes from the time you stop and must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle at all times. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times. **THIS IS NOT A WAITING ZONE.**

**FINE EXCEEDS \$191 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS**



## DRIVEWAYS AND FOOTPATHS

When exiting or entering a driveway a vehicle must give way to pedestrians on the footpath.

Driveways are not playgrounds. Be aware that children can go unnoticed in front and behind your vehicle. Do not solely rely on reverse sensors or cameras in your vehicle.

Always supervise and hold a child's hand near/crossing driveways.

It is illegal to park in or across any driveway or to block a footpath at any time.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$344 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS**



## TIME RESTRICTED PARKING

Parking signs with specified time limits allow drivers to park their vehicle for a maximum period of time, eg 5 minutes, 1 hour etc. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times.

**FINE EXCEEDS \$112**



## USING MOBILE PHONES

It is illegal to make or receive a call on your mobile phone while you are driving unless your phone is secured in a fixed mounting or does not require you to touch or manipulate the phone in any way.

It is illegal to use the other features of a mobile phone such as texting, emailing etc unless your car is legally parked and the ignition is switched off.

Using mobile phones is a major distraction for drivers and incurs higher fines and demerit points in school zones.

# School Student Travel



## School student travel information for parents and students

### School Travel Passes

Applications are now open for 2025 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) travel.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their School Opal card at their nominated postal address from mid-January 2025.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to [apply](#) or [update](#) their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their [local bus operator](#) to discuss their travel needs.

Students living in rural and regional areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note:** some rural and regional operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

### Terms of Use

Students using School Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the [Opal terms of use](#).

This includes travel within the approved times between 6.30am and 7.00pm from Monday to Friday on school days only. Students must use their Child/Youth Opal card for any travel outside these times.
