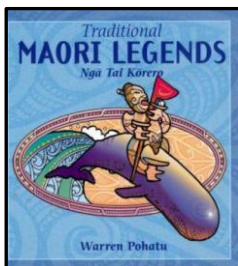
This week &

NATIONAL YOUNG LEADERS DAY

On Tuesday 25 March, 10 students from Pagewood PS attended the National Young Leaders Day at the ICC Darling Harbour: Pippa, Emelia, Fred, Taji, Zoe, Christina, Fin, Fionn, William and Deanna.

We met Mrs Kerves at 7:40am at Souths Juniors Kingsford. We used our Opal Cards to catch the light rail/tram into Chinatown station, before walking to the ICC where thousands of students were waiting. We were shocked at how big the event was going to be. Some of the students and teachers travelled 6 hours, because it was a statewide convention.

While pushing our way through the crowds, we reached our seats where Jimmy Rees was playing a clinker with chocolate eggs. Then Ezra, a teacher from The Dance Curriculum, with some friends, taught us how to boogie with fun games.

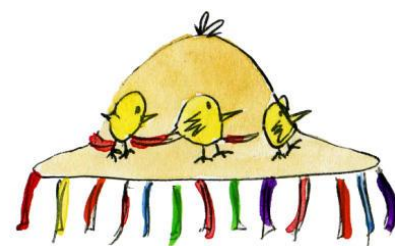

However, what is important is the joy of families working with their children not the size or the most spectacular hat. We look forward to seeing all the wonderful creations on the day! Thanks!

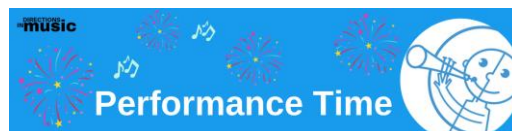

How to book

- If your child is new to Star Club, please enrol them first before we can proceed with any booking.

What to bring

1. Morning tea and lunch and water bottle. Breakfast is available until 8 am, and there's afternoon tea. Please pack a nut-free lunch for your child.
2. A jumper, hat (bucket hat preferred), enclosed shoes, a water bottle, and a spare change of clothes. Closed shoes are required, but open shoes can be brought for certain activities.
3. For water activities, pack sun-safe swimmers (like a rashie) and a towel.
4. Don't forget a big smile!

What to do each day

1. Drop off/pick up your child at the Page St gate; call the number on the sign if unattended.
2. Notify staff of absences via email or the Xplor Home app.
3. Keep unwell children at home per our health policy.
4. Dress your child in comfortable, play-friendly clothes.
5. Label all belongings (clothes, bag, hat, water bottle, etc.).
6. Inform us of any changes to your child's allergy or health needs.
7. Pick up your child by 6:00 PM to avoid a \$20 late fee for every 15 minutes.
8. Email the office if authorised contacts have changed.

Health & Additional Needs

It is imperative that you advise Star Club if your child has:

1. Any allergies or health issues.
2. Any additional needs (like ASD, ADHD, Global Development Delay, etc.), whether diagnosed or not.
3. Any changes to their allergy/health requirements.
4. Any medication needed during their time at Star Club, before they attend.

Please note that a child's booking may not be processed without sufficient information and documentation.

Weather Conditions

Excursions will proceed with light rain, but some activities may be canceled if weather worsens. Families will be notified by email and/or the Xplor Home App and alternative activities will be offered if needed.

Daily Activity

Activities may change or be cancelled at short notice due to unforeseen circumstances. In such cases, we will try to provide a suitable alternative and inform parents.

Full Day Program

A full day program with various activities, including special incursions and excursions, is offered. Daily programs are displayed on the information board.

Behaviour

Group Size & Ratio

Star Club has strict safety and supervision policies, available for viewing onsite or upon request. Children are encouraged to work with educators to follow these safety guidelines. Risk assessments for all incursions and excursions, including transport, are also available onsite or upon request.

Money/belongings
