# Premier's Sporting Challenge

We are now into the final weeks of the Premier's Sporting Challenge. All students in Years 3-6 have been provided with their log in details and shown how to record their daily physical activity through the online platform, '10 Week Challenge Activity Tracker'. Any students in Years 3-6 completing the challenge will receive a personalised certificate

(Diamond, Gold, Silver or Bronze), signed by the Premier of New South Wales. All students in K-2 will work towards a 'Gold' class award level. K-2 students' physical activity will be recorded by their classroom teacher.

The following is an outline of what is required to achieve each award level:

- Bronze 30 minutes of physical activity per day
- Silver 45 minutes of physical activity per day
- Gold 60 minutes of physical activity per day
- Diamond 80 minutes of physical activity per day

We would love as many parents and carers to get involved. It will be a spectacular performance! Keep an eye out for ways you can help.

# **STUDENT REPORTS – SEMESTER 1 2025**

From this term our school will be introducing updated school reports. The new format has been developed by the NSW Department of Education in response to feedback from parents and educators to make reports easier to read and understand.

Your child's report will show their progress across all key learning areas. Teacher comments will appear in English, mathematics and the general comment section and 'next step' goals, in line with department policy. The general comment for Kindergarten will include all other key learning areas including, creative arts, HSIE (Geography and History), PDHPE (Personal development, health and physical education), and science and technology (including digital technologies).

Teacher professional judgement about student achievement is based on quality evidence of student learning. Evidence may include results from formative and summative assessments as well as teacher observations.

A new achievement scale and descriptions are included to provide a clearer picture of your child's progress. There will be an overall achievement grade for English and mathematics. Years 1-6 will receive an achievement grade for the strands of each other key learning area and overall.

# Learning Support and English as an additional language or dialect

If your child's works with a Learning and Support teacher there will be a comment from that teacher regarding their progress. All students who are identified as having English as an additional Language or Dialect will receive a comment as per department guidelines, it will not be a separate report as in previous years. For newly arrived students (less than 4 terms in an Australian school), at the early phases of learning English as an additional language or dialect (EAL/D), schools will report through teacher comments on students' achievement in the key learning areas.

# Students with a personalised learning program

Reports for students whose learning program is based on syllabus outcomes that are different from the age/stage of their peers, will indicate achievement against syllabus outcomes and personalised learning goals identified through the collaborative curriculum planning process. These reports will include a comment for English, mathematics and a general comment about the student's progress towards individual goals.

# Achievement in Kindergarten

Our Kindergarten student reports will include achievement grades for English and mathematics.

# Reporting on effort

Our school has chosen to report on student effort in English and mathematics for all students. Recognition of effort in other key learning areas will be made in the general comment, where appropriate.

Description for parents and carers	Effort
Your child actively participates and engages in most learning activities. They always try to complete and present work to a high standard.	High
Your child actively participates and engages in most learning activities. They regularly try to complete and present work to the required standard.	Satisfactory
Your child sometimes participates and engages in learning activities. They occasionally try to complete and present work to the required standard.	Low

Other student report inclusions are:

- Attendance information
- Social development and commitment to learning (in the general comment)
- Whole school activities such as band, Maths Olympiad, dance groups, SRC etc will be recorded if your child has participated in these activities.

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION

# FULL DAY PROGRAM!

# How to book

- Go to our website and select the Vacation Care option Fill out the Booking Request Form
- · Our team will reach out to you via email to confirm your booking
- If your child is new to Star Club, please enrol them first before we can proceed with any booking.

### What to bring

- 1 Morning tea and lunch and water bottle. Breakfast is available until 8 am, and there's afternoon tea. Please pack a nut-free lunch for your child.
- 2.A jumper, hat (bucket hat preferred), enclosed shoes, a water bottle, and a spare change of clothes. Closed shoes are required, but open shoes can be brought for certain activities.
- 3.For water activities, pack sun-safe swimmers (like a rashie) and a towel. 4.Don't forget a big smile!

# What to do each day

- 1 Drop off/pick up your child at the Page St gate; call the number on the sign if unattended.
- 2. Notify staff of absences via email or the Xplor Home app.
- 3. Keep unwell children at home per our health policy.
- 4 Dress your child in comfortable, play-friendly clothes
- 5 Label all belongings (clothes, bag, hat, water bottle, etc.).
- 6. Inform us of any changes to your child's allergy or health needs.
- 7.Pick up your child by 6:00 PM to avoid a \$20 late fee for every 15 minutes
- 8. Email the office if authorised contacts have changed.

### Health & Additional Needs

# It is imperative that you advise Star Club if your child has:

- 1. Any allergies or health issues.
- 2. Any additional needs (like ASD, ADHD, Global Development Delay, etc.), whether diagnosed or not.
- 3.Any changes to their allergy/health requirements.
- 4. Any medication needed during their time at Star Club, before they attend

### Please note that a child's booking may not be processed without sufficient information and documentation.

# Weather Conditions

Excursions will proceed with light rain, but some activities may be canceled if weather worsens. Families will be notified by email and/or the Xplor Home App and alternative activities will be offered if needed.

### Daily Activity

Activities may change or be cancelled at short notice due to unforeseen circumstances. In such cases, we will try to provide a suitable alternative and inform parents.

### Full Day Program

A full day program with various activities, including special incursions and excursions, is offered. Daily programs are displayed on the information board.

# Behaviour

According to Star Club policy, the organisation retains the right to remove a child from the programme if they exhibit repeated unacceptable behaviour or actions that may jeopardise the safety of others.

# Group Size & Ratio

Expected number of children is 60-120, with 6-12 staff members. Star Club's guideline is a 114 educator to child ratio, which can vary from 112 to 18 for excursions. For precise numbers, check the excursion information and roster on display.

# Safety, supervision, transport & risk assessments

Star Club has strict safety and supervision policies, available for viewing onsite or upon request. Children are encouraged to work with educators to follow these safety guidelines. Risk assessments for all incursions and excursions, including transport, are also available onsite or upon request.

# Money/belongings

Please refrain from bringing money, electronic devices, bikes, or scooters to vacation care, unless they are explicitly included in the program. Please note that Star Club and its staff cannot be held responsible for any personal belongings if children decide to bring them to the service.

# Cost & Child Care Subsidy

Daily fees are as outlined, with enrolment fees being extra. Eligible families may receive discounts on all daily fees through the Child Care Subsidy (CCS) program. If not completed yet, please ensure you submit a Complying Written Agreement for your child(ren)'s Pagewood Public School Xplor profile and then confirm the enrolment in your MyGov/Centrelink account.

### Payment method

Direct Debit is the ONLY payment method accepted. Before confirming a booking, ensure that your Direct Debit information is updated in your Xplor online account (home.myxplor.com), and that all accounts for services are current.

### NOTE CANCELLATION POLICY

Two weeks' written notice is required to cancel a booked session, otherwise full fees will be charged, even if the withdrawal is due to illness.

Within 24 hours of session = additional \$5 per child Bookings on the morning of, or walk-ins on the day WITHOUT a confirmed booking = additional \$20 per child
